Working with students is always a challenge because everyone has their own strengths when it comes to how they learn. Neurodiverse students bring some other complex social challenges that we often find challenging to help them navigate. As with all students, there is not one strategy that works for all students with neurodiversity. We also understand that you are often working with students with little to no resources or support. We are also only recently finding that neurodiversity presents differently in people based on gender and race.



This workshop will use a panel of people that have grown up with their neurodiversity and/or parents that have learned through working with their child. This will allow participants in the workshop to hear firsthand accounts of the members on the panel about their road to diagnosis with their own learning struggles. We will hear about the experiences of these panel members that will include the positive and negative experiences that they had on their journey. They will also offer strategies to build on how we work with these students to empower them to enhance their strengths while working on other areas that do not come as naturally.
