


Have you seen PSEA's latest digital ads?

Between March 2021 and March 2022, those digital ads were viewed **5.7 million** times.






Average Starting Teacher Salaries

The lowest salary on the bachelor's column of a local association's salary schedule is what PSEA considers the "starting salary." 
These maps show the average of the starting teacher salaries in each county. Across the commonwealth, the average starting salary increased by 2 percent in 2021-22.




How Your Dues Dollars are Allocated


Legislative Priorities

In the coming years, PSEA's top legislative priority will be to address educator pipeline issues that are causing an educator shortage that has reached a crisis level.

Between the 2012-13 and 2019-20 school years, there has been a 68 percent drop in the number of Instructional I certificates issued by the PA Department of Education.

To address the educator shortage, PSEA will continue to encourage lawmakers to:

- ✓ Increase minimum teacher salaries to \$50,000
- ✓ Attract more educators of color
- ✓ Increase scholarship and loan forgiveness opportunities
- ✓ Increase the minimum wage
- ✓ Increase the number of school counselors, psychologists, and nurses
