- Be a full-time student in the junior year of college/university
- Be an education major

- Two (2) letters of recommendation from your college professors
- Most recent transcript showing your GPA or equivalent (unofficial copy is acceptable)
- Proof of being a junior education major
- A typed, double-spaced essay (500-750 words) explaining what you have learned about being a teacher from your pre-service experiences
- Contact information including current mailing address, current phone number, current email address.

10 points: Introductory letter

20 points: Letters of recommendation (2)

10 points: Grades10 points: Activities

50 points: Essay (see rubric)
