PA workers deserve a raise

Pennsylvanians who work hard and play by the rules should have every opportunity to succeed. Yet for many working families, that is becoming harder and harder to do.

That's why PSEA is advocating for an increase in the state's minimum wage to at least \$10.10 an hour, along with annual increases to keep up with inflation. It's been more than a decade since the minimum wage was increased in Pennsylvania. Raising it to \$10.10 an hour would benefit 1.2 million low-wage workers in Pennsylvania and a half million children whose parents would get a raise. Three out of four minimum-wage workers in Pennsylvania are women.

Researchers have found that an increase in the minimum wage does

more to help a local economy than hurt it. That's because it puts more money in the pockets of working families who will spend it at local businesses.

PSEA strongly believes we need to build an economy that works for all Pennsylvanians. An increase in the minimum wage is the first step to realizing that goal.
