

The Dare 2B Tick Aware Program

PA Lyme Resource Network (PALRN) was funded by the Pennsylvania Department of Health to implement a state-wide, community-based Lyme and Tick-borne disease prevention program, Dare 2B Tick Aware. The goal is to motivate communities to take pro-active steps to reduce risk, prevent tick bites, and improve early disease recognition. This program is based on current research and shares prevention steps that work and can be easily applied.
