As of October 2020, Pennsylvania's public school educators were charged to support over 70,000 English Learner students speaking 221 different languages and dialects—nearly 40% more learners than they served only five years earlier. This growth of English Learners has not been matched with increased educator training and support to serve these students in many districts. Strategies to support English Learners in classrooms and other school settings exist and often build upon practices that educators and support staff already use. Join presenters from NEA's Teach Quality Program and PSEA's own EL educators supporting you on the Council for Instruction and Professional Development in this engaging session mixing seated and hands-on learning to help you serve the English Learners in your school.
